Spring

This year started off smoothly, as we planned and implemented Voces of Mariachi, interviewing 14 San Antonio mariachis. The Mexico Center at the University of Texas at San Antonio hosted our interviewing event on March 8. We got those interviews just in time: five days later, our university shut down and our staff had to work from their homes.



We are nothing if not adaptable: we moved our entire process online and launched Voces of a Pandemic.

We are partnering with 11 institutions across the country to document the lives of Latinas & Latinos affected by Covid-19. As of this writing, we have recorded 90 interviews on Zoom. You can see our work at vocesofapandemic.org.




Summer
