As Voces celebrates our 25th year, we recognize the need to tell our story and provide the wisdom and context of history to today's challenges is greater than ever.

This year our archives served as sources for news reports ranging from lessons learned from our country's last large-scale mass deportation to honoring the 80th anniversary of D-Day as our nation reexamines our role on the global stage. We extended partnerships with **KUT** and the **Center for Mexican American Studies** to record and disseminate history. And we highlighted the challenges and triumphs of education with a special exhibit on the Uvalde walkouts, a fellowship to document Hebbronville's **Colegio Altamirano**, and preparation for our research into the historic **Palm School** and its role in a segregated Austin.

As academics and trailblazers from our 25th anniversary conference reminded us, Latinos have always been on the front lines, shaping our country's history, but it's in telling our stories that we keep the door open for all to fully contribute their gifts and talents.

Texas A&M University-San Antonio associate professor of history Philis Barragán Goetz was this year's CMAS/ Voces Oral History Collaborative Fellow. Philis' research centered on Colegio Altamirano, a small school of grades 1-5 in the South Texas town of Hebbronville. It operated from 1897 to 1958. We interviewed 16 men and women over the weekend. Philis' article from those interviews will be published in the US Latina & Latino Oral History Journal.
